Pen and Ink drawing class in October - series of 4 classes.

Discussion of the New Garden: Agreement that the new garden looks great so far! More work to be done...seasonally. The Garden Clubs were great to work with. The cost of the garden renovation was completely covered by Hopp Ground and Rusticus.
