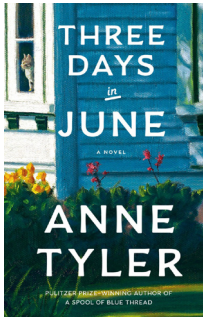

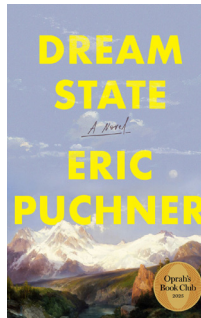
**The Dream Hotel**

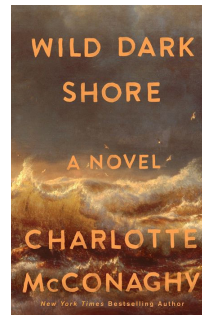
## Dream State

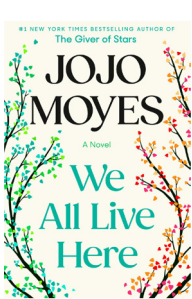
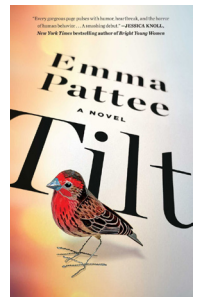
## Wild Dark Shore

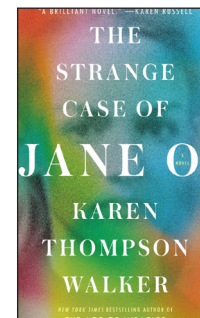
by Emma Pattee

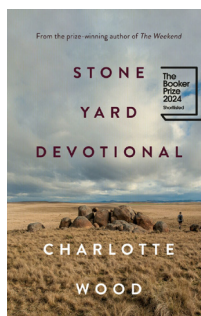


## The Strange Case of Jane O.

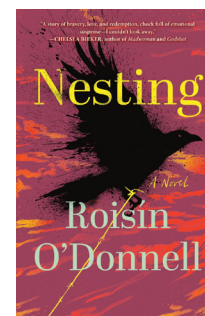
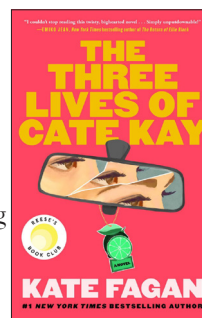
## Stone Yard Devotional

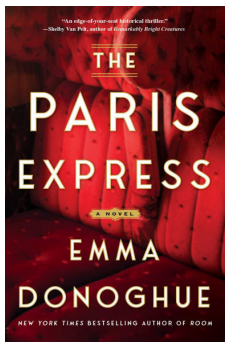
## The Three Lives of Cate Kay

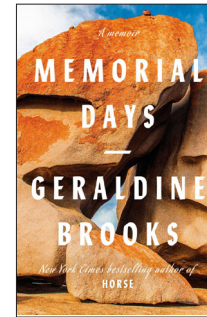
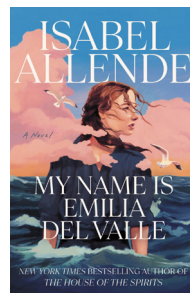


## The Story She Left Behind

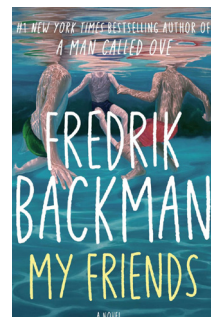
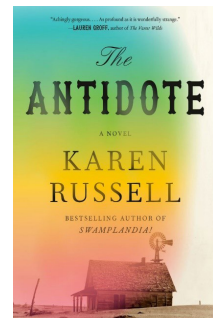

A heart rendering and beautiful memoir of sudden loss and a journey towards peace, by the Pulitzer Prize-winning author of *Horse*.

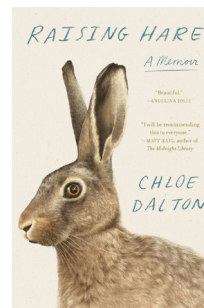
## The Antidote

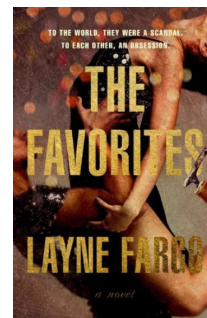
## My Friends

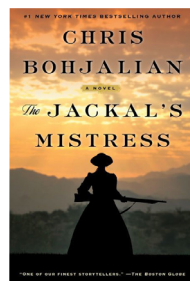


## The Favorites

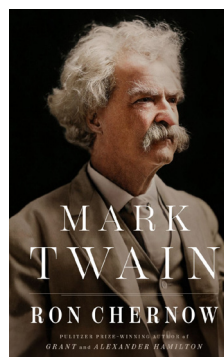
## The Jackal's Mistress

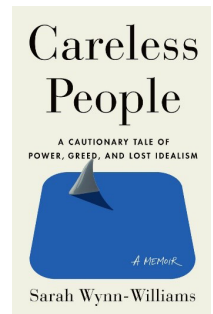
## Mark Twain
